## RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD EASTER DAY

The Resurrection of Our Lord inspired the earliest Christians to meet together every Sunday to hear God's Word and share in the Meal. Following their example, we celebrate Jesus' presence among us as the Living Lord! Our worship celebrates with grand music, lilies, the paschal (or resurrection) candle, and the joyous return of the word forbidden during Lent, "Alleluia!" Our service begins with words from a medieval mystery play\* and the Easter Acclamation. This is the day for all of us to reclaim our baptism into the death and resurrection of Jesus! It is a day for singing aloud of our faith and life in him!

*\*Our Easter liturgy begins with the oldest known medieval mystery play: the Quem Quaeritis trope. The title comes from the play's first words, Latin for "Whom do you seek?" It reenacts the dialog between the angel and the women at the tomb on Easter morning. From these humble beginnings, medieval drama developed into longer enactments of biblical events and stories, reaching its zenith in the sixteenth century with the works of William Shakespeare, Ben Jonson, and Christopher Marlowe.*

# UPDATE FROM THE CALL COMMITTEE

On behalf of the Call Committee, I am very excited to share some important news with you. As you may recall from the overview provided by Pastor Price (former Assistant to the Bishop), there is the point in the Call process where a Primary Candidate is identified. At that point, the Primary Candidate no longer pursues other Pastoral Calls, nor does the congregation pursue other candidates. I am pleased to inform you that we have chosen not just one primary candidate, but two and are considering them as (Senior) Co-Pastors. Yes, we have a clergy couple who is interested in us, and we are interested in them.

The next step is for each of the Pastors to join us to preach and lead worship. Please mark your calendars. We will have one candidate preach and lead worship on April 8. We will have the other candidate preach and lead worship on April 15. During this time, we encourage feedback to the Call Committee and Council members. There will be an opportunity for members of the congregation to informally meet the couple at a potluck lunch Sunday, April 15 at 12:15 in the MAC. *See p. 4 for details.*

There are still several critical steps in the process after these visits. We continue to work with the Executive Committee and Council and will keep you abreast of the process as we move forward. As you know, the final step is a congregational vote.

It is important for us throughout the process to protect the anonymity of the candidates. It is not healthy for a home congregation of a candidate if members know the pastor is exploring other opportunities. We ask you to help us protect their anonymity.

Thank you for your patience, prayers and partnership. This is truly a time of spiritual discernment for our faith community. We greatly appreciate your support.

### SUMMER OF SERVICE Intergenerational Program Sundays, June 10 – August 26 at 9:30 in the MAC


