

FLOODING UPDATE



When we arrived Sunday, June 3, we were met with 2-3 inches of standing water in two-thirds of our basement. We are very proud and thankful for everyone who helped in a myriad of ways to deal with this situation.

Now, we are working hard to get the downstairs area back in working order. A contractor came this past

Monday to test moisture levels to be sure it is safe to start putting things back in place. He found that most of the areas with drywall still have 100% moisture readings near the bottom of the walls. Our carpets and vinyl floors are still holding moisture as well.

There will be some construction in the downstairs area for the next few weeks as we open up walls and possibly take up/replace flooring to let things dry out and prevent mold growth.

We are sorry for the disruption this will cause with meetings and other gatherings during this time.

Evening meetings can still take place in their regular location.

- We will **engage in conversation during a time of fellowship** for young and old alike.


This change assumes the goodwill of all worshipers and will be a positive challenge for our congregation. Our usual pattern of services will resume September 9.
