SHARING GOD'S WORD



Christian Formation is *Sharing God's Word* by providing Bible studies, women's groups, an elementary youth group, fellowship, and Sunday morning Christian Formation groups. Here are opportunities for all ages, birth to adults:

Newborns to 2-year-old children meet in the nursery. The Nursery Coordinator will bring children into worship for Children's Time with the pastors and then return them to the nursery where they will listen to simple Bible stories and songs.

Children 3 years to 3rd grade begin in the Sanctuary. After Children's Time with the pastors, children go to their classes listed below:

- Preschool children go upstairs to the Teddi Nelson Education Wing.
- Children K-3rd Grade will go to the MAC (Muhlenberg Activities Center – behind the church) on the 1st and 3rd Sundays. On the 2nd and 4th Sundays, they will go to the Nielsen Room for Children's Church and then return to their parents in worship.

Children in grades 4-5 start at 9:30 upstairs in the MAC.

All children should be picked up from their classes immediately following the end of the 9:30 service.

Grades 6-12 – see p. 7 for Confirmation and high school class information.

All adults are invited to take part in one of these adult classes that meet downstairs:

- **No Experience Necessary:** An in-depth Bible study suitable for everyone. You need have no experience, and all are welcome. Meets in the Library (downstairs).
- **40-Day Journey:** Readings, Reflections & Spiritual Growth: an interactive class where Christian literature is read and discussed. Meets in the Kairos Room (downstairs).

Children's Church at 11:00 on the 1st & 3rd Sundays is for children 3-7 years old (*held downstairs in the Nielsen Room*). After Children's Time with the pastors, leaders will take children downstairs. They will join their families in the Sanctuary during the Sharing of the Peace.

You are encouraged to pick up a green **Christian Formation brochure** from the Connection Center. It includes information about all our Christian Formation opportunities. We hope you will find one or more that fulfills your needs as we grow together in faith!

FORWARDING FAITH CAMPAIGN

Youth ministry and faith formation have always been at the center of the ministries of the Virginia Synod, ELCA. Youth and faith formation activities of the Virginia Synod have led many of our members to positions as both lay leaders and rostered ministers in our churches.

In 2015, the Virginia Synod Council voted to create the *Forwarding Faith* campaign in order to raise \$2.5 million. The goal is to establish a permanent endowment to underwrite youth ministry and faith formation activities and programs in Virginia.

Over the next few weeks, Muhlenberg will participate in the *Forwarding Faith* campaign. You will find additional materials in *The Chimes* and in the Gathering Area that will provide you with more information about Muhlenberg's campaign and youth and faith formation ministries of the Virginia Synod. Our campaign will kick off **NEXT Sunday, September 16** and conclude with Celebration Sunday, October 14.
