# WHAT'S THE BUZZ?

### HAPPY 175<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY 1978's Lutheran Book of Worship

Today's worship continues our liturgical journey through history. We've experienced worship from 1795, 1847, 1917, and 1958; today we make use of 1978's Lutheran Book of Worship (known to many lifelong Lutherans as "the green book.") We've replicated almost in its entirety a worship service that happened on February 4, 1990. We're using the same liturgy and hymns from that day, including the same special music (prelude, postlude, and choir anthem). You can find more information about the Lutheran Book of Worship, as well as a reproduction of the bulletin from February 4, 1990, in today's worship booklet. It's fun to note that two of the people who served in worship that day, Patti Covington and James Armentrout, are now ordained pastors!

The hymnals we are using for this series are on display in the Gathering Area — check them out to hold a piece of history in your hands!

- 3. Voted to approve a slate to serve as Nominating Committee
- 4. Voted to approve a slate of 4 of the 6 April 27 Synod Assembly Representatives
- 5. Determined together how to proceed with our Muhlenberg Constitution ratification and intend that Muhlenberg Bylaws will be updated this coming year
- 6. Planned for the Congregational meeting

# Congregational Meeting Update

At last Sunday's Congregational Meeting we received Muhlenberg's 2023 Annual Report. It is a beautiful document reporting in both words and images the vibrant life of our church body over the past year. I commend it to your reading. Recognized outgoing council members: Kevin Stees, Bruce Hamilton, & Joe Grandstaff.

We voted to approve:

- Our Nominating Committee for 2024: Joe Grandstaff, Bruce Hamilton, Elizabeth Fletchall, and Sandra Blade
- Representatives to the April 27 Virtual Synod Assembly: Oris Griffin, Kristee Trumbo, Rachel Peters, Karen Barnes, Jacob Dunlap and Karen Thomsen
- Ratified our revised Constitution by a vote of 62 to 18, which, at 77.5% exceeded the 2/3rds (66.7%) majority requirement. There was good discussion regarding the revisions as well as sections of our constitution that were not revised this time. New or ongoing constitutional questions can be directed to the members of the Constitution Task Force, Brad Moyers, Cathy Copeland, or Pastor Lauren Eanes. # SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE SUPPER

#### Tuesday, February 13, 6:00 pm



Shrove Tuesday is the name given to the day before Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. It is traditionally the day when Christians would prepare for Lent by confessing their sins, and being "shriven" (absolved.) In A.D. 600, Pope St. Gregory prohibited Christians from eating all forms of meat and animal products during Lent, so they began to make pancakes on Shrove Tuesday to use up their supply of eggs, milk and butter, which also

earned it the name "Fat Tuesday." The tradition continues today all around the world—including here at Muhlenberg on Tuesday, February 13!

So mark your calendars now for the upcoming Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper in the MAC. Pancakes, sausage, egg casseroles and fruit provided. Bring your appetite and celebrate Fat Tuesday with us at Muhlenberg. Doors open at 6:00 pm, but if you arrive early, you're welcome to wait in the Gathering Area and visit with others there.



# LOCAL & GLOBAL MISSION 2024 LENTEN PROJECT

During Lent, Local & Global Mission is coordinating a hands-on project for our congregation on behalf of Lutheran World Relief (LWR). They are holding a drive to supply Personal Care Kits, one of their most requested items, to those in need. You are invited to share your LOVE (EVOL) with our neighbors around the world.

Starting Sunday, February 18, we will ask for their suggested items during these Lenten five weeks in order to make as many complete kits as we can at wrap-up. There will be a donation box in the Gathering Area where you may donate each week or all at once if that's easier for you. The following items, weeks 1-5, make one complete kit.

- Week 1 Sunday, Feb. 18: One new light-weight (not fluffy as thin dry quicker in the sun), dark-colored towel (between 20"x40" and 27"x52").
- Week 2 Sunday, Feb. 25: Two or three bath-sized bars of soap (in original wrapping).
- Week 3 Sunday, Mar. 3: One adult toothbrush (in original packaging).
- Week 4 Sunday, Mar. 10: One sturdy comb (remove packaging).
- Week 5 Sunday, Mar. 17: One metal nail clippers (remove packaging).

LWR is asking for these new, undecorated items specifically as they want to ensure that all the kits are identical for all.

The tradition of Easter Lilies in the church are a beautiful way to remember and honor loved ones. We have added some additional, seasonal color to the mix by offering **Easter Lilies, Hydrangeas, and Hyacinths**. The cost per plant is \$25, with a limited number of plants available. To reserve your Easter flowers, do the following:

Flowers may be picked up Easter Sunday after the 11:00 am service. **Sign up deadline is Sunday, March 17** (no additional flowers will be ordered after that date).



# HOLY WEEK

The Triduum (The Three Days) is the ancient observance of the mystery of our salvation, which plunges the faithful into the death of Jesus and brings them with him to resurrection life. The Three Days is one liturgy, extending from Thursday evening through the Easter Vigil. You are invited to conform your life to the worship rhythms of the church on these three days:

**Palm Sunday, March 24, 8:30 am and 11:00 am** Palm Sunday is focused on Jesus' willingness to upset the status quo of the empire's kingdom, and subvert the powers and principalities with a new revolution. This r(evol)ution of love transforms the world!

**Maundy Thursday, March 28, 7:00 pm** We heed Christ's commandment to love one another as we wash each other's feet and share the meal he instituted.

**Good Friday, March 29, 7:00 pm** We hear the passion of Christ, the narrative of Jesus crucified and reigning from the cross.

**Easter Vigil, Saturday, March 30, 8:00 pm** This is the high point of the church's year, the night, the very night, the Passover of Christ from death to life. This year's Vigil will be a simplified version of the traditional liturgy. We'll begin with the lighting of the new fire, and process into the sanctuary for the reading of the Word. 16 readers will share with us the entirety of the gospel of Mark, for a truly epic experience of the gospel story. We'll then gather around the communion table to celebrate the first resurrection meal. Following the service, we'll extend the celebration of Easter with food and fellowship.

**Easter Sunday, 8:30 am and 11:00 am** The ultimate r(evol)ution of love came about through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Christ is risen, and through him all creation is made new! On Easter Sunday, in word and feast, we celebrate God's unending love.

**Easter Egg Hunt** Easter Sunday inside the MAC at 9:45 Join for our annual Easter Egg Hunt. In addition to the hunt there will be an opportunity to have a family picture taken and printed, games, and activities for kids of all ages.

### **CONFIRMATION CORNER**

Confirmation isn't just for middle schoolers! All the baptized who have been confirmed are called to grow in faith and affirm God's promises in their life. You can support the hard work of our middle school students by reflecting on these Confirmation Corner thoughts each week. Here's a confirmation prompt for this week:

#### From <u>What Should We Expect When We Read</u> <u>the Bible?</u> by Dr. Darrell Jodock:

We should expect to be challenged. The Bible provides a picture of what it means to live as a child of God and as a follower of Jesus. For example, one in ten verses in the Gospels are about wealth and our uses of it. We hear, "Blessed are you who are poor" (Luke 6:20). To the rich young man Jesus says, "Go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor" (Mark 10:21). It is important that we not too quickly say -- oh, all of this just affects one's attitude toward riches. That insulates us from the challenge of these texts, from the challenge of doing justice. We need to let the challenge confront us.
