HAPPY 175TH ANNIVERSARY 2006's Evangelical Lutheran Worship & 2020's All Creation Sings

Today's worship concludes our liturgical journey through the history of the Lutheran Church in the Shenandoah Valley. We've experienced worship and music from 1795, 1847, 1917, 1958, and 1978, and today brings us into the modern Lutheran Witness with Evangelical Lutheran Worship and All Creation Sings. With the Service Book and Hymnal (SBH) being known to many as the beloved "Red Hymnal", the ELW is known in many circles as the "Cranberry Hymnal."

Concluding with a service that blends these two hymnals is a perfect representation of the approach that ELW brings to worship. With 10 settings for Holy Communion, and 3 more added by ACS, liturgical flexibility that meets the context of a community was the hallmark of this liturgical renewal. With the advent of digital resources, you'll note that the word "book" is, for the first time, missing from the hymnal's title, reflecting that no more will the liturgical tradition of the Lutheran church be bound by one book.

The ELW and ACS offer congregations a faithful foundation upon which we can explore themes, cultures, and specific spiritual needs in worship.

The hymnals we have used for these historical services are on display in the Gathering Area—check them out to hold a piece of history in your hands! The worship booklets we've used are also available in the Gathering Area, and we encourage you to enjoy any service you missed on our YouTube channel! TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

Today's festival of the Transfiguration of our Lord is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins in several days. On a high mountain Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. This vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem. We turn this week to Ash Wednesday and our yearly baptismal journey from Lent to Easter.

LENT is a time of reflection and self-examination during the 40 days before Easter. We are invited to engage in faith practices like prayer, fasting, giving, and acts of love, as we walk through the mystery of Jesus' journey from death to life. This year, we'll be guided on that journey by the gospel of Mark. We'll see how God is on the loose, breaking into our world. Through Jesus, God is overthrowing the established order and bringing a fundamental change to the way we live and interact with one another, with the love of Christ at the center. It's a R(EVOL)UTION!

SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE SUPPER

THIS Tuesday, February 13, 6:00 pm



Shrove Tuesday is the name given to the day before Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. It is traditionally the day when Christians would prepare for Lent by confessing their sins, and being "shriven" (absolved). In A.D. 600, Pope St. Gregory prohibited Christians from eating all forms of meat and animal products during Lent, so they began to make pancakes on Shrove Tuesday to use up their supply of eggs, milk and butter, which also

earned it the name "Fat Tuesday." The tradition continues today all around the world—including here at Muhlenberg on Tuesday, February 13!

So mark your calendars now for the upcoming Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper in the MAC. Pancakes, sausage, egg casseroles and fruit provided. Bring your appetite and celebrate Fat Tuesday with us at Muhlenberg. Doors open at 6:00 pm, but if you arrive early, you're welcome to wait in the Gathering Area and visit with others there.



LENTEN DEVOTIONS



February 18

Journeying Through Lent with Mark is a Christ-centered guide to the Gospel of Mark for daily devotion during Lent. Each day provides a meditation based on a passage from Mark's Gospel with reflection questions and a prayer, giving us time each day to reflect on the life, death, and resurrection of Christ, and on our lives as followers of Christ. Books are available in the Gathering Area, with a suggested donation of \$8 each. To contribute to devotionals, place your check (made payable to MLC, designating Lenten Devotional) in the offering plate or the wooden box located next to the devotionals.

LOCAL & GLOBAL OUTREACH 2024 LENTEN PROJECT

During Lent, Local & Global Outreach is coordinating a hands-on project for our congregation on behalf of Lutheran World Relief (LWR). They are holding a drive to supply Personal Care Kits, one of their most requested items, to those in need. You are invited to share your LOVE (EVOL) with our neighbors around the world.

Starting Sunday, February 18, we will ask for their suggested items during these Lenten five weeks in order to make as many complete kits as we can at wrap-up. There will be a donation box in the Gathering Area where you may donate each week or all at once if that's easier for you. The following items, weeks 1-5, make one complete kit.

- Week 1 Sunday, Feb. 18: One new light-weight (not fluffy as thin dry quicker in the sun), dark-colored towel (between 20"x40" and 27"x52").
- Week 2 Sunday, Feb. 25: Two or three bath-sized bars of soap (in original wrapping).
- Week 3 Sunday, Mar. 3: One adult toothbrush (in original packaging).
- Week 4 Sunday, Mar. 10: One sturdy comb (remove packaging).
- Week 5 Sunday, Mar. 17: One metal nail clippers (remove packaging).

LWR is asking for these new, undecorated items specifically as they want to ensure that all the kits are identical for all.

The tradition of Easter Lilies in the church are a beautiful way to remember and honor loved ones. HOLY WEEK

The Triduum (The Three Days) is the ancient observance of the mystery of our salvation, which plunges the faithful into the death of Jesus and brings them with him to resurrection life. The Three Days is one liturgy, extending from Thursday evening through the Easter Vigil. You are invited to conform your life to the worship rhythms of the church on these three days:

Palm Sunday, March 24, 8:30 am and 11:00 am

Palm Sunday is focused on Jesus' willingness to upset the status quo of the empire's kingdom, and subvert the powers and principalities with a new revolution. This r(evol)ution of love transforms the world!

Maundy Thursday, March 28, 7:00 pm

We heed Christ's commandment to love one another as we wash each other's feet and share the meal he instituted.

Good Friday, March 29, Ecumenical Walk, 12 noon and Worship, 7:00 pm

Annual Harrisonburg downtown ecumenical prayer walk, 12 noon – 1:00 pm. We hear the passion of Christ from the Shenandoah Valley Biblical Storytellers, the narrative of Jesus crucified and reigning from the cross.

Easter Vigil, Saturday, March 30, 8:00 pm

This is the high point of the church's year, the night, the very night, the Passover of Christ from death to life. This year's Vigil will be a simplified version of the traditional liturgy. We'll begin with the lighting of the new fire, and process into the sanctuary for the reading of the Word. 16 readers will share with us the entirety of the Gospel of Mark, for a truly epic experience of the Gospel story. We'll then gather around the communion table to celebrate the first resurrection meal. Following the service, we'll extend the celebration of Easter with food and fellowship.

Easter Sunday, March 31, 8:30 am and 11:00 am

The ultimate r(evol)ution of love came about through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Christ is risen, and through him all creation is made new! On Easter Sunday, in word and feast, we celebrate God's unending love.

Join us for our annual **Easter Egg Hunt** inside the MAC at 9:45. In addition to the hunt there will be an opportunity to have a family picture taken and printed, games, and activities for kids of all ages.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING UPDATE

At the January 28 Congregational Meeting we received Muhlenberg's 2023 Annual Report. It is a beautiful document reporting in both words and images the vibrant life of our church body over the past year. I commend it to your reading. A link to the report is here:

We also recognized outgoing council members: Kevin Stees, Bruce Hamilton, & Joe Grandstaff.

We voted to approve:

- Our Nominating Committee for 2024: Joe Grandstaff, Bruce Hamilton, Elizabeth Fletchall, and Sandra Blade
- Lay representatives to the April 27 Virtual Synod Assembly: Oris Griffin, Kristee Trumbo, Rachel Peters, Karen Barnes, Jacob Dunlap and Karen Thomsen
- Ratified our revised Constitution by a vote of 62 to 18, which, at 77.5% exceeded the two-thirds (66.7%) majority requirement. There was good discussion regarding the revisions as well as sections of our constitution that were not revised this time. New or ongoing constitutional questions can be directed to the members of the Constitution Task Force, Brad Moyers, Cathy Copeland, or Pastor Lauren Eanes. CONFIRMATION CORNER

Confirmation isn't just for middle schoolers! All the baptized who have been confirmed are called to grow in faith and affirm God's promises in their life. You can support the hard work of our middle school students by reflecting on these Confirmation Corner thoughts each week. Here's a confirmation prompt for this week:

From What Should We Expect When We Read the Bible? by Dr. Darrell Jodock:

We should expect to find meaningful **answers for life**, but we should not expect to find in the Bible an answer for every ethical decision we face. In the Bible we discover how God in Christ Jesus reveals a message of new life and true wisdom. By "wisdom" I mean the skill of putting knowledge to work in such a way that humans benefit. I mean by it our understanding of what makes humans tick what benefits them and and how communities work and what benefits them. We face many ethical challenges as we seek to live in the world as God's people. We don't expect to read the Bible to find a detailed list of do's and don'ts. Luther did not read the Bible that way. Just as Jesus had done and the apostle Paul had done, Luther urged people to love their neighbors. Then Luther expected that they would use their wisdom to decide what this entailed. So, on the one hand, we need to take what we find in the Bible seriously enough to let it challenge us. But, on the other hand, we also have been freed by the Gospel ("for freedom Christ has set us free," Gal. 5:1). We are not to be enslaved by the instructions found in the Bible but rather to use our God-given wisdom to serve our neighbor.
