Palm/Passion Sunday ~ April 2 at 8:30 am and 11:00 am*

With palm branches in our hands, we sing "Hosanna" to our king, then follow Jesus to the cross. Walter Wangerin, Jr.'s "The Cry of the Whole Congregation" invites us into the drama of Christ.

Maundy Thursday ~ April 6. 7:00 pm *

In this deeply moving service, we reflect on Jesus' final words and actions with his disciples, with individual confession and forgiveness, foot washing, Holy Communion, and the stripping of the altar.

Good Friday ~ April 7, 7:00 pm*

Flowers may be picked up Easter Sunday after the 11:00 am service. **Sign up deadline is NEXT Sunday, March 26** (no additional flowers will be ordered after that date).

"THE WHY CROSS"

QUESTIONS ANSWERED

This week's question was written in a child's handwriting, and I'm so glad they asked: *Why do we have communion?*

God gave communion as a special meal to share that helps us know how much God loves us. When we have this meal, we *remember*, we *receive*, and we *celebrate*.

When we eat the bread and drink the wine, we *remember* the special meal that Jesus had with his friends before he died. We also remember that Jesus died on a cross, and on Easter, God raised Jesus to life. And we remember that all of that happened because of how much God loves us.

When we share in communion we also *receive* forgiveness of sins. We all sometimes do things that are wrong or hurt other people. But when we receive this gift of bread and wine, placed in our hands, that we can touch and taste, we can trust that we are forgiven.

And that gives us a reason to *celebrate*! Communion is like a big party where God calls all God's children to come together, be strengthened by the meal, and then go out into the world full of God's love to share with other people.

So we have communion so we can remember, we can receive, and we can celebrate God's love for each and every one of us.
