1. **Book Study of *Stamped from the Beginning* with Pastor Alex ~ 7:00 – 8:30 pm**

Repentance is central to the season of Lent and racism is a sin. As we seek to repent from the sin of racism that manifests in personal and systemic ways throughout our nation and lives, we must learn how we got here. *Stamped From the Beginning: The Definitive History of Racist Ideas in America* by Ibram X. Kendi will serve as our guide to these conversations. We will bring the lens of faith and repentance to conversation around racism in our history and our present. The book is divided into 5 sections which we will cover each week.

2. **Prayer and Contemplative Practices with Linda Alley ~ 7:00 – 7:30 pm**

Would you like something fresher and deeper for your prayer time? Learn about five types of contemplative prayer and practice them during this 5-week workshop. Most types encourage more listening than speaking and more spacious rest than effort. Led weekly by Linda Alley, each half-hour session will include teaching, practice and feedback.

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Lent is a 40-day season of preparation for the resurrection of Jesus. Throughout the season, our Daily Digital Devotionals will focus on Lenten Micropractices. Through our [Muhlenberg Digital Devotionals Facebook Group](#) or [in your email inbox](#), you'll find a new practice to guide you each day on your journey of preparation. Some practices can be done on the spot, some during the day, and others will take some time and/or prep work. Traditionally, there are three pillars of Lent: praying, fasting, and alms giving, which come to us from Matthew 6:1-18. Our micropractices rotate through these themes, along with additional practices that don't fit neatly in one of those categories ("more"). DILL PICKLE SOUP

Submitted by Karen Thomsen

5 ½ cups chicken broth
1 ¾ lbs potatoes, peeled and cut in 1 inch cubes
(I don't peel mine)
2 cups chopped carrots
1 cup chopped dill pickles (about three large)
5 tablespoons unsalted butter
½ cup flour
1 cup sour cream
¼ cup water
2 cups dill pickle juice
1 ½ teaspoons Old Bay seasoning
½ teaspoon coarse ground pepper
¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper
Optional garnishes: diced dill pickles, fresh dill, black pepper

In a large pot combine the broth, potatoes, carrots, and butter. Bring to a boil and cook until the potatoes are tender. Add pickles and continue to boil.

In a medium bowl stir together the flour, sour cream and water.

Vigorously whisk sour cream mixture, 2 tablespoons at a time, into the soup. Potatoes may break apart but this is okay. Whisk and let cook until the broth is creamy, about 5 minutes.

Add the pickle juice, Old Bay, pepper, and cayenne. Cook for 5 more minutes and remove from heat. Serve with or without garnishes.

Here's a message from Congregation Council President Karen Thomsen:

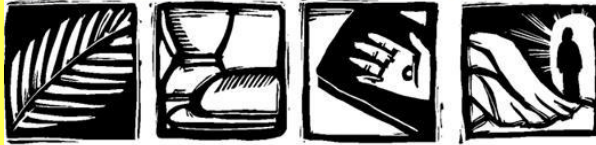

HOLY WEEK & EASTER



As we continue our *Unexpected* journey with Jesus, join us for worship during Holy Week and Easter!

Stop by the church **Friday, March 26, 3:00-6:00 pm** or **Saturday, March 27, 10:00 am-noon** to pick up a **Holy Week Worship Kit**, including live palms for Palm Sunday.

Palm Sunday (March 28), we'll begin with an at-home Procession of Palms, celebrating as Christ comes into our midst, and then follow with trepidation as his path leads to death on the cross through the reading of the Passion story from Luke. Worship will be at **8:30 am** on [ZOOM](#) and **11:00 am** on [Facebook](#) and [YouTube](#). (*This year, we ordered eco-palms. See p. 9 for details.*)

Monday - Thursday of Holy Week (March 29-April 1), we'll join with congregations around the Valley for daily worship at **12:15 pm** on YouTube (see next week's issue of *The Chimes* for links).

Maundy Thursday (April 1), we'll remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, and Jesus' commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. Worship will include Holy Communion and take place on [ZOOM](#) at **7:00 pm**.

Good Friday (April 2) draws us to the cross, as we worship on [Facebook](#) and [YouTube](#) at 12:15 pm through the Virtual Community Prayer Walk, an annual ecumenical tradition. We'll gather once more at **7:00 pm** on [Facebook](#) and [YouTube](#) for a contemplative reflection on the Seven Last Words of Christ.

Easter Vigil service (April 3) proclaims through story and song that God continually brings life out of death! Join us at **7:00 pm** on [Facebook](#) and [YouTube](#) for the lighting of the new fire, creative retellings of the salvation story by the Muhlenberg community, a remembrance of our baptisms, and a celebration of the night of salvation.

Easter Day (April 4) brings 3 opportunities for celebrating the resurrection with Muhlenberg. We'll join in songs of praise and the feast of Holy Communion at **8:30 am** on [ZOOM](#). At **11:00 am** on [Facebook](#) and [YouTube](#), gather around sacred words in a festive, musical celebration. At **4:00 pm**, we'll meet in person from the safety of our cars in the parking lot to proclaim Christ's victory over death, including Holy Communion.

Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem was celebrated by using palm branches, according to the Gospel of John. Lutherans around the world recount this story of Jesus, re-enacting the waving of palms on Palm Sunday.

To ensure that palms are harvested in a more environmentally sustainable way whereby harvesters can earn a fair income for their labor, Muhlenberg Lutheran Church is purchasing "eco-palms" for Palm Sunday. As far back as March 16, 2008, Lutheran World Relief has partnered with Chamaedorea Palm Certification Project to build support for eco-palms in the United States. Purchasing eco-palms benefits farmers, families and communities in cooperatives where they are grown. It's a way each of us can walk-the-walk with Jesus on Palm Sunday.

UPDATE/GREAT COMMUNITY GIVE

"Blessed is the one who is kind to the needy." (Prov. 14:2)

It's been over a year that schools closed down and Second Home started to plan how we could support our families in need. With the encouragement and generous support of Muhlenberg and the local community, we have been able to continuously provide support, first in the form of groceries and later with child care. I am happy to report that 90% of our staff are fully vaccinated making it safer for us to continue working with the children.

Students at Second Home have been completing their virtual classes/assignments in a safe and supportive environment. They have also participated in academic enrichment such as the research projects and presentations that 3rd - 6th graders worked on during Black History Month in February.



We are happy for our K - 2nd graders and 6th graders who will start in-person classes Monday, March 22. They are ready to see their schools and teachers in person. We will continue to support these grades with before and after school programming. 3rd - 5th grade students are continuing their education virtually and will stay at Second Home all day. We are excited about an offer of an outdoor stage area to continue our annual musical tradition. We are hopeful that restrictions will be reduced by June to allow our students to perform in front of an outdoor audience.
