Easter is the crown of the church year, the queen of feasts, and as such it lasts for a week of weeks (7 weeks). The Day of Resurrection is celebrated with gold paraments to give it unique

prominence. The paschal candle burns near the altar throughout the season as a sign of the presence of the risen Christ. Lilies, symbols of the resurrection, surround us. Our liturgy is enhanced with processions, the return of the "Alleluia" and joyful music. We invite you to join us each week in Easter as we worship, pray, learn, support and serve together in ministry and mission.

SPECIAL FOOD COLLECTION Sundays in April

The Local & Global Mission Committee's focus for April is Patchwork Pantry (70 South High Street, Harrisonburg). It is entirely volunteer operated and distributes food and supplies to make sure no one in our community goes hungry. The pantry currently serves 60 - 65 households regularly every Wednesday night. Also, in the past few months they've had more limited choices through free USDA programs.

Each Sunday in April, our committee is asking for specific donations of **ketchup**, **mustard**, **mayonnaise**, **and relish**. The pantry will distribute these items in May to help families be prepared for warm weather meals. These items are occasionally available from Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, but are nearly always in tiny little restaurant packages.

LENT WRAP UP

Our Lenten series *Why?* has been a fruitful time of faithful questions and reflection on following Jesus.

Over 80 people participated in *Why Groups*, gathering once a week for four weeks to reflect on Scripture and life together. Feedback from the groups was positive, with many participants reporting lively conversation and deeper connections. A few groups have decided to keep meeting regularly! In case you missed it, we plan to offer short-term small group opportunities several times a year.



Provocative questions were placed on the *Why Cross* throughout Lent, and the pastors did their best to answer them in a concise way! These questions and responses were printed in *The Chimes* (available on the <u>Muhlenberg website</u>) and recorded for Facebook and Instagram, if you'd like to go back and reflect on them. Several people also shared deeply personal reflections on the question "What is your 'Why?" and we are grateful for these responses that helped us all reflect on our faith. Many have asked if we plan to continue to offer an opportunity for questions and answers related to the Christian faith and the answer is yes! Keep an eye on *The Chimes* for information about how to submit a question going forward.

Our Lenten recital series was filled with extremely gifted musicians, and the six-week series brought week after week of powerful, moving music. Many thanks to Elizabeth Williams for the work she did to coordinate these recitals, and especially for the music she shared during her final recital here at Muhlenberg before her retirement in May.

The congregation responded generously to the invitation to support Church World Service this Lent. Hundreds of personal and household items were given to be shared with our new neighbors, refugees being resettled here in the Valley. We were grateful for the work of Rockingham Girl Scout Troop 713 as they volunteered their time to organize and pack up the donations.

Although Lent is coming to a close, we know the work of discipleship and seeking the "Why" of our lives is not over. We hope and pray that this season has deepened your faith and increased your connection to God and to one another. As we move into the Easter season, we'll focus around the theme "Walking in Newness of Life" as we explore ways to continue the journey as followers of Jesus.

CREATION CARE

Composting is something that people have done for generations. With separation from our food source, it has



become easy to see food scraps as nothing more than trash. Leftovers, organic trash, and even leaves raked from lawns are collected together. With time and tending, decomposition generates heat that breaks these items down. They become rich soil for new planting.

ENDOWMENT FUND NEWS

Muhlenberg Lutheran Church has two active Endowment funds. The Seminary Scholarship Endowment Fund is available to assist members who attend seminary. Our current



recipient, Mycah McNett, is completing her final semester at United Lutheran Seminary.

Pre-K to 5th Grade ~ Muhlenberg Activities Center (MAC) and Outside (weather permitting) Led by Children's Minister Ashley Saunders, kids will have an opportunity to grow together through the "Living the Word" curriculum, which follows the Narrative Lectionary. Kids will enjoy learning biblical stories, doing activities to put the stories into action, and building strong relationships. Older students will have the opportunity to help share the stories with younger students to cultivate a collaborative community.

PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE (PHP)

People Helping People has had a very busy beginning of the year. We have seen unprecedented client numbers with more people coming with their



utilities already disconnected resulting in large bills that are all due at once to reconnect. Even with our help being limited to \$400 a year per household (split up \$200, every six months), the donation dollars are just not meeting the need. Our donations for January were less than \$5,000; however, we gave over \$14,000 to 88 households. In February we gave \$10,500 to 51 households. As we close March over \$12,000 has been distributed to 72 households.

REMINDERS

KIDS AND THE NURSERY

Children are always welcomed and encouraged to be a part of our worship services, and their presence and participation are important! Activity packs are available in the Gathering Area that include quiet activities related to worship and the weekly Scripture reading. We also have a weekly children's message in worship.

For our very youngest (birth to age 4), quality childcare is provided each Sunday in the nursery 8:15 am - 12:30 pm, so little ones will have a safe space to be during worship and Christian Formation.

ENTERING THE CHURCH

Jesus was able to walk through locked doors (see John 20) but entering Muhlenberg's building is sometimes a little harder for those who come to the church on a weekday! For the safety of all who use our space during the week, all doors remain locked at all times. When you arrive at the church, we ask you to call the church's main phone number, located on a sign on the Gathering Area doors, and a staff person will come to open the Gathering Area door for you.

ACCESS SERMONS ONLINE

Following the Narrative Lectionary allows us to tell a continuous story of faith week after week. WORSHIP LIVE-STREAMED AT 11 AM
