# FAITHFUL PEOPLE, FAITHFUL QUESTIONS




While the season of Lent is over, our faithful practices do not simply end. Throughout this Lenten season, many of our members have taken the opportunity to use the *Why Cross* in the Gathering Area to ask wonderful questions, and the Pastors have enjoyed taking the time to answer them as faithfully as possible. Just as Jesus was constantly met with and asked faithful questions, holy curiosity is meant to be at the heart of a healthy Christian community. To that end, we are offering the opportunity for

Muhlenberg members to ask faithful questions in perpetuity! In the pews, you'll now find light purple cards, where you are invited to ask questions whenever one arises. *The purple cards are a reminder that our Lenten discipline continues beyond those 40 days*. These can be big theological questions, life questions where you'd like a faithful response, inquiries about something confusing you read in scripture, or a simple question about why something happens in worship. Any question is welcome!

You can either place your purple card in the Offering Plate, or in the purple lock box at the Connection Center. Please always add your name to the questions so we can follow up directly. The Pastors will take time to answer these questions, often sharing the answers in *The Chimes*, or in video format on Facebook, Instagram, or YouTube for the benefit of the wider community. There will also be the opportunity to ask questions confidentially if you wish. Simply check the *Keep Confidential?* box on the card, add your contact information, and place it in the lock box. Only the Pastors have access to this box. For confidential questions they will arrange to respond to you one-on-one via email or through a face-to-face conversation. Questions can also be asked digitally using THIS GOOGLE FORM.

If you have any questions about this process, please reach out to the Pastors. We look forward to our continued discernment and growth together as we demonstrate that Muhlenberg Lutheran Church is a community where questions, doubts, and struggles are a welcome part of equipping all people to live out Christ's love.

#### **CREATION CARE**

Store your winter clothes caring for without mothballs. Mothballs might keep moths from nibbling holes in your



favorite sweater, but their toxins are harmful to the environment. Mothballs are made from dichlorobenzene, a pesticide that may get into groundwater and can be toxic to animals.

There are more environmentally friendly options for storing your winter clothes. For example, put them in an airtight container with bay leaves or cedar blocks — both are natural materials that will repel moths and keep your clothes smelling fresh until next year.

### PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE (PHP)

People Helping People has had a very busy beginning of the year. We have seen unprecedented client numbers with more people coming with their



utilities already disconnected resulting in large bills that are all due at once to reconnect. Even with our help being limited to \$400 a year per household (split up \$200, every six months), the donation dollars are just not meeting the need. Our donations for January were less than \$5,000; however, we gave over \$14,000 to 88 households. In February we gave \$10,500 to 51 households. As we close March over \$12,000 has been distributed to 72 households.

#### <u>Implicit Bias — What You Don't Think</u> You Think

# A REMINDER – TEXT & EMAIL SCAMS

We've heard from some members about a recent **email scam**, involving emails that pretend to be from Pastor Lauren (using a different email address that features the word "pastor") and addresses the recipient by their first name in the subject line. See the example below:

Scams such as these are a common annoyance for our members, our Pastors, and our staff - and we just wanted to remind you of steps to take if you ever receive a suspicious message like this one. Thank you to those who have alerted us, and please see the tips below!

We encourage you to follow these guidelines for messages claiming to be from Muhlenberg Pastors or staff members:

- If you receive a suspicious message, we remind you that it's best **not to respond**, to **block the email / account**, and to **delete the message**.
- **Authentic emails** from Muhlenberg Pastors and staff will come from addresses that end in "muhlenberglutheran.org".
- **Texts** from Pastors will only come from **their cell phone numbers**.
- Please note that Muhlenberg Pastors and staff will **never** reach out to you directly in a text, email, or social media direct message (like Facebook Messenger) asking for favors, money, gift cards, etc.
- Finally, **if you have any questions or concerns** about a suspicious message, please feel free to email Christian Perritt, Communication Minister, at <a href="mailto:perritt@muhlenberglutheran.org">perritt@muhlenberglutheran.org</a>, or you can email the church directly at <a href="mailto:info@muhlenberglutheran.org">info@muhlenberglutheran.org</a>.
