#### CREATION CARE



Store your winter clothes without mothballs. Mothballs might keep moths from nibbling holes in your favorite sweater,

but their toxins are harmful to the environment. Mothballs are made from dichlorobenzene, a pesticide that may get into groundwater and can be toxic to animals. There are more environmentally friendly options for storing your winter clothes. For example, put them in an airtight container with bay leaves or cedar blocks — both are natural materials that will repel moths and keep your clothes smelling fresh until next year.

#### **CONFIRMATION CORNER**

From "Five Key Lutheran Principles" by Mark Allan Powell. Here are key principles that Lutherans follow when they study or interpret the Bible.

3b. Scripture **Interprets Scripture:** Justification by Grace through Faith. Lutherans believe that the Bible as a whole presents God as gracious and merciful and "abounding in steadfast love" (Exod 34:6; Ps 103:8; Joel 2:13). We are unworthy sinners, but we have been reconciled with God through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. God sent Jesus to die for our sins, and we can be put right with God through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ (Rom 5:1-11; Eph 2:8). Since Scripture as a whole teaches this, we know better than to think that our own efforts or merit will improve our status with God or increase God's love for us. There are many passages of Scripture that encourage us to do good works, and we take those seriously, but we do not think that those works will enable us to earn favor with God. Interpreting Scripture in light of Scripture leads us to view the call to good works as an invitation for people redeemed by God's grace to act as the transformed spirit-filled "new creations" that God has made them to be (2 Cor 5:17; Gal 5:22-23).
