ADDITIONAL PARKING

On special days like Pentecost Sunday, we are blessed with more people in attendance. Sometimes, if can be challenging to find a parking spot in the lot surrounding the church. We have agreements with our neighboring businesses for additional parking on Sundays, so remember you can always park in the following locations as well:

- The Ott Street Parking lot behind the MAC beside the Ott Street House (which we share with Michael Layman Law Group). Do not park in Urban Exchange's lot on the corner of Ott and Water Streets with numbered spaces (you may be towed see details below!).
- Gary's Piano lot next to the church.
- Farm Credit lot across East Market Street.
- Michael Layman Law Group lot across from the Water Street entrance to our parking lot (note: parking cones may be moved for church parking use).
- Wharton, Aldhizer & Weaver Law Offices lot between W. Water Street & Newman Avenue.
- Visit the Connection Center for a parking map.

WALKING IN NEWNESS OF LIFE STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN

Over the past few weeks, we've heard stories about how Muhlenberg has inspired others to "Walk in Newness of Life." As we prepare to return our Intent Cards next Sunday (May 21), take time this week to reflect on the ways in which connection to our ministry has impacted you and those you know and love in the past year and start dreaming about what God may be up to here moving forward.

As you consider your giving to the church this year, please consider how you can grow in your own generosity. Here are some ideas:



- 1. Systematic giving leads to generosity: For most people, we can grow significantly in our giving just by making our gift on a regular basis. Sign up for automatic giving (contact Finance Manager Jane Eanes [eanes@muhlenberglutheran.org / 540-434-3496) or just add an amount each week or month. Growing giving by \$1 per day equates to significant growth over the course of the year.
- 2. An extra gift or two during the year: One congregation member said, "I'm not sure what the future holds for me, but for now I am doing okay, so I will double my giving in the month of April." Well, what if we decided to double our giving one month or even two months next year?
- 3. Grow by a percentage each year: For some, the idea of a tithe is unachievable in a single year, but something people would like to reach someday. By growing giving by a percentage each year, it is achievable over the long term. If you currently give away 2% of income, perhaps you can reach 3% next year and 4% the year after. This takes discipline, but over the long term can be very effective!
- 4. An idea for someone whose income has gone down in the last year: Everyone can grow in generosity, even if that means the overall dollars given decreases. Perhaps, if before your income decreased you were giving away 2% of your income, now with income being less, can you find a way to grow the percentage of giving to 3 or 4%.

You may have your own ideas for growing in generosity. As a church family, as we each grow in our generosity, it will have a tremendous overall impact. Keeping our ministry strong will enable us to dream about an ever-growing ministry into the future!

Note from the Pastors

It is such a privilege to serve as your pastors! We love to hear from you when things are going on in your life, so that we may pray with you, grieve with you, rejoice with you, and provide you with spiritual support. But here's the thing...we cannot read your mind! We need you to be in touch with us when you'd like to connect.

When to Contact the Pastor(s)

Please, please, contact one of us when...

You or a loved one is going into the hospital. With tighter privacy restrictions at RMH, we often cannot be told by the hospital that you are there, even if we call and ask. It's up to you or a member of your family to let us know about a hospitalization.

You have a birth in the family. Pastors love to hear about births in the family and celebrate this special time with you! If you're up for a visit, we'd love to stop by the hospital and say a special blessing for the new baby.

You have a life-threatening illness. We want to walk with you through this difficult time to bring God's strength and hope along the way.

There is a death in the family or funeral in our church. When there is a death, your pastors would like to know immediately—any time, day or night. We are never "too busy" to bring the comfort and assurance of God's love in the darkness of grief. Please also consult one of the pastors before a funeral date is set.

You would like a prayer said for you. We are always happy to do this! We will keep all prayer requests confidential unless you make a specific request that we notify the prayer chain team.

You would like a pastor to visit with you. Whether you'd like a visit at home, at the church, or in a coffee shop, please invite us! Maybe you have a specific spiritual concern, or maybe you just want to get to know the pastor better. We want to get to know you too--invite us over!

You have a question or concern about something at church. Many church-related questions that people have can be cleared up easily. Please talk to the pastors instead of allowing misunderstandings to become rumors!

You are thankful and want to share your joy! What a gift it is to us to be able to celebrate with you!

This is obviously not an exhaustive list. Give a pastor a call if you have a question about faith, your marriage is strained, you're facing a difficult decision, you're struggling with grief, you're approaching a major life transition, or anytime you are in need of spiritual care. We are here for you!

How to Contact the Pastor(s)

Call the church or send us an email. This is the best place to start. Text messages are ok if you need a quick and easy response during normal business hours, but generally calling or emailing is best. The church phone number and pastors' email addresses are on the masthead of *The Chimes* every week. Email addresses for all staff are also available from the staff page of our website. https://www.muhlenberglutheran.org/staff.html

If it's urgent, start by calling the church. If no one answers, then you can hear our cell phone numbers in our voice mail greeting. Don't hesitate to call our cell phone at any time if it's an emergency.

Please do not pass a message along through someone else. If they forget to tell us, then everyone feels bad. And sometimes the message gets conveyed in a different way than you'd prefer. Just give us a call or send us an email!

Please do not contact us via Facebook or Instagram. Those messages always seem to get missed! Email and phone are much better.

If you have a non-urgent message, please do not call or text the pastor on their day off. Pastor Lauren is off on Thursdays, and Pastor Alex is off on Fridays. You are very welcome to email them on those days, but understand that you probably won't hear back from them until the next day. However, don't hesitate to call on their day off for a true emergency.

Please give us grace. We do our very best to respond to every message we receive in a timely manner, but we mess up sometimes. If you don't hear back from us within a few hours for a truly urgent matter, or within 48 hours for a non-emergency, then please try again. Sometimes emails don't go through or messages aren't received. You can also feel free to contact Parish Administrator Linda Depoy to help ensure your message was received and when you might expect a response.

In summary: If you find yourself at any point thinking, "I sure would like to talk to a pastor," get in touch! We can't read your mind, but we do very much want to connect with you.
