## WHAT'S THE BUZZ?

#### SYNOD ASSEMBLY REPORT



Lutherans from all around the Virginia Synod gathered at Roanoke College June 9-11 for the 2023 Virginia Synod Assembly with the theme "The Way in the Wilderness," based on Isaiah 40. Muhlenberg was well represented by voting members Pastor Lauren Eanes, Pastor Alex Zuber, Gus Kagey, John Mulder, Mark Warner, Greta Willis, Kristee Trumbo, and Deacon Doug Price. Mycah McNett also attended as an At-Large Voting Member, and Hawke Trumbo as a Visitor. Three youth attended the Youth Assembly, held concurrently with the Synod Assembly: Kat Kolodinsky, Keira Miller, and Brendan Miller. Lily Harmison was present in her role as the Synod Youth Ministry Intern, as well as a member of Synod Council. And of course, Bishop Bob and Barbra Humphrey were there too!



With the pending retirement of Bishop Bob Humphrey, the Assembly undertook the process of electing the next Bishop of the Virginia Synod. On the sixth ballot, the Rev. Dr. Phyllis Blair Milton,

Pastor at Holy Communion, Portsmouth, was elected with 175 votes to 172 votes for the Rev. Kelly Bayer Derrick, Assistant to the Bishop of the Virginia Synod. Bishop-elect Milton will take office September 1. She will be installed as Bishop on Saturday, October 21 at First Presbyterian Church in Waynesboro.

The Assembly elected Blythe Scott (First, Norfolk) to serve as the new Vice-President of the Virginia Synod and elected Judy Casteele, (Good Shepherd, Lexington) to serve as the Secretary of the Virginia Synod.

In addition to the election of the Bishop, Vice-President, and Secretary of the Synod, the Assembly elected lay leaders to serve on the Synod Council, the Consultation Committee, and the Committee on Discipline. Lily Harmison was re-elected to serve on Synod Council. The Youth Assembly also elected new leaders, and Kat Kolodinsky, who served on the Lutheran Youth Organization Board this past year as the 9<sup>th</sup> grade representative, was elected to serve as the 10<sup>th</sup> grade representative next year.


The Assembly approved the 2023 and 2024 Investment in Ministry Plans, the 2021 and 2022 Synod Audits, and the Compensation Guidelines for 2024. Bishop Humphrey and the Officers of the Synod shared their reports and the Assembly heard from a variety of mission partners through ministry moment videos. We also celebrated the Bishop's leadership over the past six years.

We were blessed with many opportunities for worship, including a Festival Service of Holy Communion that included commissioning eleven lay preachers, including our own Kristee Trumbo. Judy Wilfong will also be commissioned as a lay preacher at the Synod's Power in the Spirit event in July.

Overall, it was an eventful weekend filled with thoughtful discernment and discussion, meaningful relationship building, and fun celebration! Don't hesitate to reach out to any of the attendees if you have questions or want to hear more about the Assembly.

## A NEW WORSHIP SERIES: LOVE THE SINNER, HATE THE CLICHÉ

As Christians, we want to say the "right" thing when we express God's love and faithfulness to others. But often it can be easy to fall into using clichés that are ultimately less than helpful. We insist that "every-



thing happens for a reason," and hope that God "won't give us more than we can handle." When we don't know how to comfort a grieving friend, we resort to "God must have needed another angel in heaven." In our struggle for certainty, we claim that "the Bible says it, I believe it, and that settles it." We embrace phrases like "God helps those who help themselves," and "love the sinner, hate the sin." But while these phrases make good bumper stickers, do they accurately express what we believe to be true about God and discipleship? In this 6-week series which began last Sunday, we'll take a look at a few common clichés and see just how useful (or useless!) they really are.

#### Virginia Synod Assembly

Last weekend was quite exciting at the Virginia Synod Assembly, where our new Bishop was elected. If you were able to follow along with us, it was quite a close race, with the 5<sup>th</sup> vote ending in a 170 tie resulting in several people whom had not previously voted requesting ballots and the 6<sup>th</sup> vote of a simple majority ending in the election of Rev. Phyllis Milton. This makes our Bishop-Elect the first woman and the first BIPOC Bishop in the ELCA's Virginia Synod history. We also gave thanks to Bishop Bob Humphrey for his service to the Virginia Synod these past 6 years. Kristee Trumbo was Commissioned as a Lay Preacher and the 9<sup>th</sup> grade voting Youth Representative at Assembly was Kat Kolodinsky!
