From June 14 - July 19, we are exploring the Psalms in worship. We will move through the Psalms in a manner that reflects how we experience the life of faith: from orientation (when life is stable and the world seems trustworthy), to disorientation (when the bottom drops out and the tradition seems like a lie), to reorientation (when faith in a trustworthy God is found again, but the experience of disorientation is not forgotten).

TABLE TALKS ON RACISM AND JULY'S PASTORS' BOOK CLUB

Wondering where to begin with conversations around anti-racism? If phrases like *white privilege*, *systemic racism*, *reparations*, or *white supremacy* are new or challenging to you, please join us for further discussion. Muhlenberg will host digital Table Talks on Racism **TODAY, July 12, 1:00 pm** and **THIS Wednesday, July 15, 6:30 pm**. These Table Talks will involve pre-reading an article and then small group conversation over Zoom. Wish to continue conversations on anti-racism and dismantling white supremacy with a particular focus on the church? Join us **Wednesday, July 29, 6:30 pm** via [Zoom](#) for a Pastors' Book Club conversation on *Dear Church: A Love Letter from a Black Preacher to the Whitest Denomination in the US* by ELCA Pastor Lenny Duncan. About *Dear Church*: Lenny Duncan is the unlikeliest of pastors. Formerly incarcerated, he is now a black preacher in the whitest denomination in the United States: the ELCA. Shifting demographics and shrinking congregations make all the headlines, but Duncan sees something else at work—drawing a direct line between the church's lack of diversity and the church's lack of vitality. The problems the ELCA faces are theological, not sociological. But so are the answers. Part manifesto, part confession, and all love letter, *Dear Church* offers a bold new vision for the future of Duncan's denomination and the broader mainline Christian community of faith. *Dear Church* rejects the narrative of church decline and calls everyone—leaders and laity alike—to the front lines of the church's renewal through racial equality and justice. It is time for the church to rise up, dust itself off, and take on forces of this world that act against God: whiteness, misogyny, nationalism, and economic injustice. Duncan gives a blueprint for the way forward and urges us to follow in the revolutionary path of Jesus. (*Content warning: This book contains strong language.*)

Plastic pollution is one of the greatest human-made threats our planet faces. Of the approximately 275 million metric tons of plastic waste produced annually, up to 12 million tons leak into oceans, wreaking havoc on livelihoods and ecosystems. The result is an estimated \$13 billion in annual environmental damage to marine ecosystems, in addition to other economic losses and significant health and human concerns. In order to prevent plastic pollution in marine and other environments, the global community will need a dedicated instrument that will address the full lifecycle of plastic from production and design to waste prevention and management. Let's make an attempt to **break free of plastics**.
