
CREATION CARE: FOOD AND FAITH SERIES

Does what's on my dinner plate have anything to do with what I say I believe on Sunday morning? We'll explore this question together for the next three weeks in our *Creation Care:* Food and Faith sermon series. We'll examine how food is really about the relationships between us and the earth, fellow creatures and humans, and ultimately God. Next, we'll dig into our foods' roots in the soil, and why the way we treat the land as we produce food matters to God. Finally, we'll see how the sharing of food is the sharing of God's love.

On our final Sunday of the series, September 3, we'll welcome Deacon Phyllis Cox, who leads Care of Creation initiatives in the Virginia Synod, to lead us in a tree planting liturgy.

Thoughts on Food and Faith

"Food is a holy and humbling mystery. Every time a creature eats it participates in God's lifegiving yet costly ways, ways that simultaneously affirm creation as a delectable gift, and as a divinely ordered membership of interdependent need and



suffering and help. Whenever people come to thev demonstrate the table unmistakable evidence of their stomachs that they are not self-sustaining gods. They are finite and mortal creatures dependent on God's many good gifts: sunlight, photosynthesis, decomposition, soil fertility, water, bees and butterflies, chickens, sheep, cows, gardeners, farmers, cooks, strangers, and friends (the list goes on and on).
