Eugene Peterson notes when we read scripture, we “see our stories in God’s.” **Beginning TODAY**, we will participate in God’s story as we follow the Narrative Lectionary in our weekly sermons and engage in study and reflection on these texts.

The Narrative Lectionary is designed to follow the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church. The weekly texts have been selected to highlight the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture, while arranged in a narrative sequence to help us see Scripture as a story that has coherence and a dynamic movement. By the time we conclude in May we will have touched on the great stories of scripture and gone more deeply into their themes and context. A Note from Our Pastors

When we suspended in-person gatherings in March, none of us knew how long our separation would last. This time “in exile” has been longer than hoped, and harder than desired. However, we have not ceased to be church, and we look forward to a dynamic fall season of ministries together.

The Gathering Together Task Force has been working hard to provide thoughtful, prayerful guidelines for safe interactions this fall. They conducted a survey of the congregation which received almost 100 responses. The overwhelming response was a desire for Muhlenberg to maintain and expand our digital ministries, and not rush to in-person events. After reviewing the survey, current COVID trends in Harrisonburg, our congregation’s mission and vision, and input from staff and Congregation Council, the Task Force recommends an expansion of worship opportunities and at-home devotional resources, while maintaining our current guidelines for use of the building and parking lot.

There are still many reasons to be optimistic about a just, sustainable, clean energy future. Over several weeks, we are sharing nine of **Climate Reality's** favorites.

4. EVs Are Racing to the Front:

Transportation is the second-largest emitting sector globally, and vehicles are another major source of harmful air pollution. So what's the good news here? Electrical vehicles (EVs) are taking off! With more and more renewables on the electricity grid, EVs can greatly reduce the carbon footprint of our transportation.

5. Agricultural Solutions are Growing Fast:

Agriculture holds a rare position in the fight against the climate crisis. As it's managed now, global agricultural production is a major contributor to global GHG emissions. And yet, some of our most powerful tools for storing carbon (and keeping it out of our atmosphere) are agricultural in nature. [Regenerative agriculture](#) has the capacity to restore vast tracts of land and switch them from carbon sources to carbon storage, while at the same time making farmland (and farming communities) more resistant to the impacts of climate change.

6. The Youth Are Here and Their Mission is Clear:

So the solutions exist! We can reduce GHG emissions and get cleaner air, cleaner water, and a more sustainable food system out of the bargain. But what are we doing to get our leaders to support these ideas so that the transition happens quickly enough to avoid the worst impacts of the climate crisis? You've likely heard about the global youth movement. Last September they led a record-breaking strike with over 10 million participants.

Gemeinschaft Home

Gemeinschaft Home is a live-in community in Harrisonburg where nonviolent offenders can transition from prison back into society while being offered support, education and respect. Rooted in values such as mutual self-help, peers as role models, and work as therapy, it offers them a chance to learn and breathe, gaining the tools needed for productive living. What can we do?

- Uplift in prayer those in transition, that they open doors to a better life.
- Consider donating. In honor of their 35th anniversary, they are having a fundraising campaign. Some of their projects include a residential women's program, a licensed counselor, and needed repairs.

PICK UP/DROP OFF BOX

During this time when the church building must remain locked, staff discovered a need for a way to get materials to and from members. It is located outside the Gathering Area on the edge of the planter nearest the MAC.
