WHAT'S THE BUZZ?

This week, we announced that Wade Meyers is resigning from his position as Music Minister of Muhlenberg Lutheran Church. Below is a letter from Wade and a message from Pastor Lauren Eanes.

Dear Muhlenberg Family,

I am writing this letter with a heavy heart and after much thoughtful deliberation. After a wonderful yet short period serving as the Music Minister at Muhlenberg Lutheran Church, I have decided to resign. This decision comes as a result of a complex set of personal factors involving my family and our new home in Monterey. Rest assured, this is not due to any issues with the pastoral leadership, working environment, or the Muhlenberg community, all of which I have found to be incredibly rewarding and positive.

From the moment I joined the Muhlenberg community, I have been welcomed with open arms. I have felt a strong sense of belonging and purpose here, and I cherish the relationships we have built. The staff, volunteers, choir members and musicians are some of the finest people I have ever had the pleasure of working with. I am proud of what we have been able to accomplish in the time I

have been here and I am committed to ensuring a smooth transition.

Although I won't be serving as I had hoped and planned, my thoughts, prayers, and good wishes will forever be with the Muhlenberg congregation. I consider it a true blessing to have been a part of such a warm, welcoming, and God-centered community.

As for the path forward, the Pastors and Congregation Council are busy developing a solid plan. More information will be shared soon, but please know that I am committed to aiding in a seamless transition in any way possible.

Once again, thank you for the incredible experience, the faith you've placed in me, and the opportunities to serve this wonderful congregation. What you have at Muhlenberg is genuinely special. I will greatly miss being a part of this community, but I am comforted knowing that Muhlenberg will continue to thrive and be a sanctuary for all who enter its doors.

NEW DOOR ENTRY SYSTEM

Knock, knock! Who's there? You are, and you're trying to get into the church! You may have noticed there's a new doorbell system on one of the Gathering Area doors. It's the first step in a new entry system to make our building more secure and easier for people coming to church during the week!



During the week: When you arrive at the church, come to the Gathering Area doors and press the doorbell (instructions are posted on the door). When the call is answered, please identify yourself, and the door will be unlocked remotely so you can enter. Please note that the office is staffed Monday through Friday from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. If you arrive outside of those hours, there's still a good chance someone will be here, but please call before you come to be sure. Please do not use the red doors at the back of the building — for security reasons, these doors are now reserved for Day Care use only.

On Sundays: Our practice is to unlock only the Gathering Area doors for entry on Sunday mornings, allowing for greater security. All doors can be used to exit the building.

If you regularly enter the church (for example, if you are part of the Altar Guild and need to access the building during off hours to set up) and/or if you currently have a key, we will be assigning PIN numbers to unlock the door via the keypad on the entry system. We plan to rekey all exterior doors at a later phase in the entry system project, so keep an eye on *The Chimes* for more information about how to get a PIN number and turn in your key. Thank you for your undoorstanding as we learn this new system!

SECOND HOME LEARNING CENTER

NEW PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Second Home is pleased to announce that it has been awarded a 21st Century Community Learning Center grant to provide academic



enrichment, and remediation to 50 students from Spotswood Elementary School. This funding from the Virginia Department of Education is a major recognition of our work and requires rigorous programming for the funded students in literacy, math, STEM, and social-emotional learning. Grant funding may be renewed for two more years. We are very excited about this opportunity.

However, funding is school specific and **only covers 50%** of our program. We are determined to provide the same quality of education and services **to all of our students** and their families regardless of the school they attend. We are determined to choose compassion over business. We serve many of the most marginalized students in the City, (e.g., the single parent family with 3 children that recently became homeless or the single parent family with 7 children of whom 3 are cared for at Second Home).

There are many **meaningful ways you can partner with us** to serve the community. We need volunteers to tutor and help with literacy activities. We also need specific in-kind donations and donors to sponsor tuition. We charge parents \$35/child/week, while the real cost of caring a child is \$88/week. The fees cover breakfast, afternoon snacks, background-checked staff, space use and program supplies. 
