Since its earliest centuries, the church has set aside a day to remember the great cloud of witnesses who have gone before us in the faith, stretching across the centuries and around the globe. Today we give thanks for the saints who have gone before us, for the saints of God who are living, and for saints still to come. We are especially thankful for the witness and works of those who have died in the faith as they modeled what it means to be both saint and sinner. We remember by name those who died in the past year, and look forward to sharing with them the life that is eternal. We also remember by name those who have been baptized in faith this past year, and rejoice with these new saints being born in the baptismal waters. Most of all, we remember the one whose death and resurrection has formed this company of all the saints, hallowing all our lives and deaths.

HYBRID ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

Our Annual Congregational Meeting will be Sunday, November 19, 2023 at 9:45am in the Sanctuary. I hope all voting members will make every effort to attend in person or by Zoom (non-members are very welcome to attend, but are unable to vote). Adult, Middle School, and High School Sunday School classes will be canceled the morning of the 19th, while Pre-K through 5th grade classes WILL happen as scheduled and the nursery will be staffed to enable all voting members to participate.

At this meeting we will review and approve the 2024 Ministry Spending Plan, elect new council members and a trustee, and vote on proposed revisions to our congregation's Constitution. Please review the materials provided at www.muhlenberglutheran.org/congregationalmeeting (or pick up a hard copy at church) and don't hesitate to reach out to me, Treasurer Sarah Sunde, or the Constitution Task Force members (Cathy Copeland, Brad Moyers, and Pastor Lauren Eanes) with any questions you may have. We will also make ourselves available to answer questions following each service on Sunday, November 12.

As you review the Constitution, you'll see that a quorum of at least 50 voting members is required for a congregational vote to occur. But we hope *everyone* will plan to attend this gathering to participate in the life of our community here at Muhlenberg!

STEP 1: ZOOM DOWNLOAD

First, download the Zoom app. Go to https://zoom.us/download and follow the prompts for installation. Visit the website highlighted on page 4 for a video tutorial about Zoom.

STEP 2: ATTENDING THE MEETING

Once Zoom is downloaded, you're ready to attend the meeting:

- The meeting is <u>SUNDAY</u>, <u>NOVEMBER 19 at 9:45 am</u>. Please logon up to 10 minutes before the meeting using the "Sunday Mornings at Muhlenberg" Zoom link: https://us02web.zoom.us/j/84731416878
- Follow the prompts to <u>run Zoom</u>, and then wait for the meeting host to let you in. If for some reason Zoom doesn't open, you can always <u>open Zoom manually</u>, select "Join a meeting" and enter this 11-digit Meeting Code: **847 3141 6878**.
- Once you are admitted by the host, select "Join with computer audio."
- For voting, please follow the instructions of the moderator so votes can be accurately tallied.

STEP 3: ZOOM ETIQUETTE

- To assist moderators, <u>edit your name</u> on Zoom to include the names of all voting members in your home.
- Mute your audio (click on the "Mute" option) until you are asked to unmute.
- Make sure video is turned on so the host can see you and know you're still logged in.

CATHY COPELAND, COUNCIL NOMINEE



I have appreciated serving on Council for the past three years. As part of my work on Council, I served as one of Muhlenberg's Faith in Action (now Valley Interfaith Alliance)

representatives from 2020-2022. This year, I led the Constitutional Task Force as we worked to align Muhlenberg's Constitution with the ELCA's required and recommended modifications.
